Summary

In 2021 we were unfortunately unable to resume our field assignment work as we had hoped – due to the continued global Covid-19 pandemic. However, we made major changes to our Web portal and added new content.

We awarded an institutional educational grant to support indigenous education in Thailand. We engaged our followers on social media.

Governance

In 2021 Teodora Corina Hasegan resigned from her role as Director of Research and Development. We thank her for her eleven years of service in that role and wish her success in her future endeavors.

Web Portal Strategy

Our "tic-tac-toe" strategy, first adopted in 2015, has served our mission successfully for the last seven years and we decided in 2021 to continue applying it for the foreseeable future. "Tic" means keeping our Web portal up to date with the latest information technology trends. "Tac" means publishing new content. "Toe" is design — the user interface and user experience of our Web portal.

Tic. 2021 was a "tic" year. We upgraded our platform to newer, faster and more secure hardware and software. We also had a custom digital security certificate issued so that our Web portal now uses the latest secure (https) World Wide Web communication protocol (TLS version 1.3).

We also made many optimizations on our platform for faster transfer of content to our visitors. Our analysis shows that, for the average viewer, pages are now transferred between two and three times faster than before. For image-intensive pages, the increase is up to ten-fold.

Tac. We continued to publish our monthly opinion editorials giving an indigenous peoples' perspective on current events. Our latest opinion editorial is published on the first day of each month on our home page. Our cumulative, year-to-date opinion editorials are always available at:
